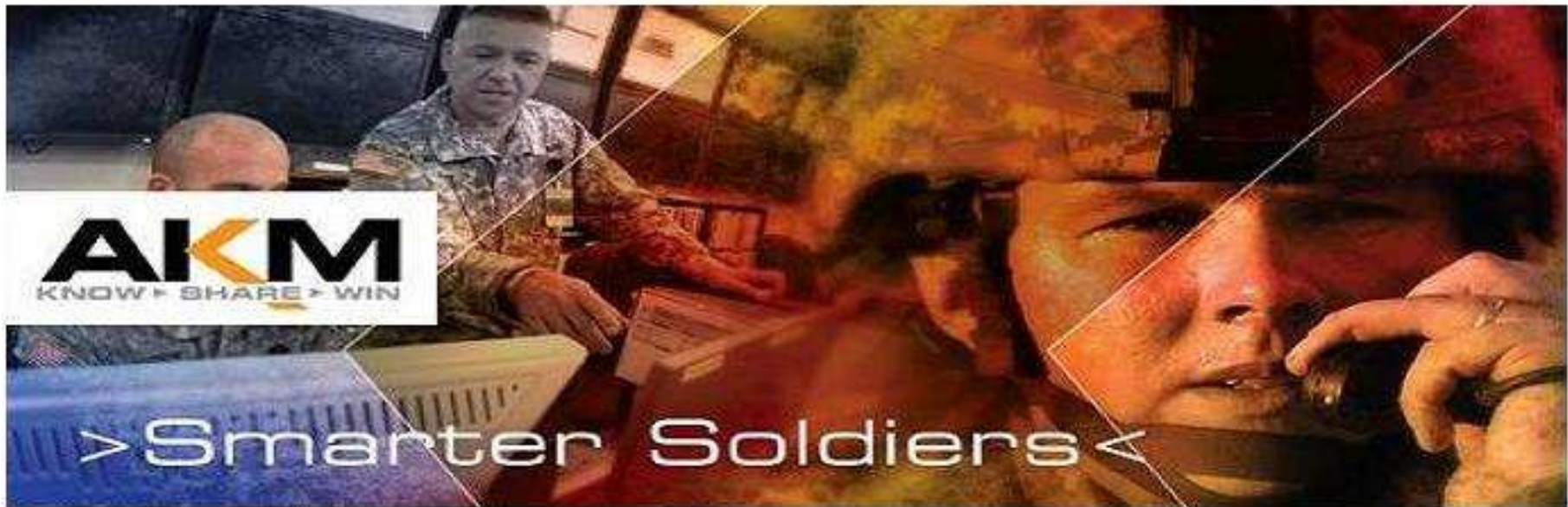

Enduring Principle
